I Treasurer's Report

- Discussions will be had with Nate Hooegeveen regarding agreement between IWC and Don Propst regarding boat.

VII. Signage at Rapids

- Upon request, CIP and IWC provided input to Mike Delaney regarding whether or not to put a sign warning of rapids above Commerce Ledges. Many opinions were expressed, but the majority opposed a sign above Commerce Ledges. It appears that the water trails group is going to put a warning rapids sign at the access 11 miles upstream of Commerce Ledges. Nate Hooegeveen recommended a 12 x 12 inch sign instead of the 36 x 36 inch sign.

VIII. Miscellaneous Business

- There was unanimous voice vote by IWC Board members to support the Iowa Environmental Council petition to the Iowa Department of Natural Resources to implement a proposed set of well-researched antidegradation rules for the state. The legal action and proposed rules are meant to assist the DNR in moving forward to adopt this important requirement of the federal Clean Water Act.
